Requirement for Recipients

1. Recipient must be accepted into Rend Lake Community College
2. Recipient must have a “B” average or equivalent to a 3.0.
3. The student must be currently enrolled at Rend Lake Community College and/or a graduating senior from one of the following high schools in Community College District 521 (Franklin, Hamilton, Jefferson, Perry, Washington, Wayne, White, and Williamson counties)

4. Recipient planning to major in business or finance is preferred, but not required.
 5. Recipient must be involved in philanthropic organizations and volunteer in the community.
 6. Recipient must demonstrate moderate to significant financial need.
