- **Custom Account Alerts:** By setting custom alerts for your account, you could be notified of transactions over a specified amount, checks clearing your account, or deposits that have been made. There are also options to receive a simple message containing your balance.

How Can Alerts Help?

- **Immediate Action:** If you receive an alert for a transaction you did not authorize, you'll have the opportunity to act quickly. This could mean contacting your financial institution immediately to review your account or using features like **Card ON/OFF** to temporarily disable your card until you're able to confirm a transaction you don't recognize.
- **Review of Subscriptions:** Receiving account alerts could notify you of any subscription transactions you've unintentionally signed up for. By being notified of the transaction right away, you'll have an advantage when reaching out to these companies to cancel or ask for a refund.
