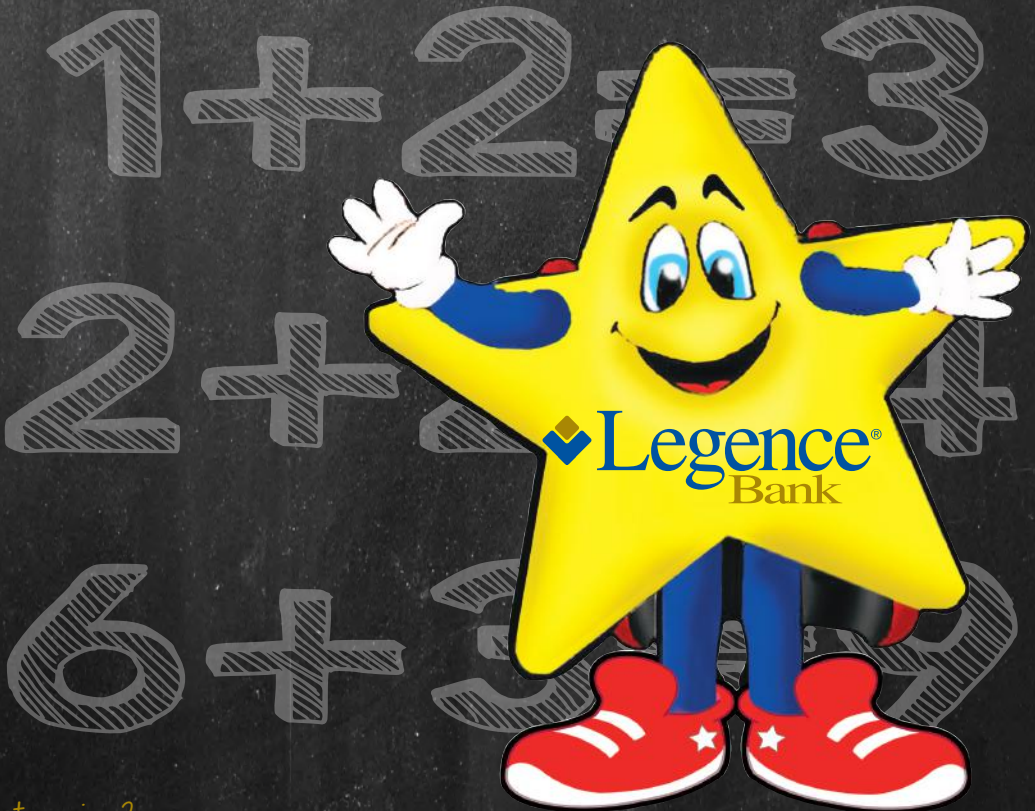

THE PENNY



The penny is worth one cent. Abraham Lincoln was our 16th President and is on the front of the penny. The Lincoln Memorial, in Washington D.C., is on the back of the penny. It takes one hundred pennies to equal one dollar!

The nickel is worth five cents. Thomas Jefferson was our 3rd President and is on the front of the nickel. Monticello, a historical landmark in Virginia and a home Jefferson designed and built, is on the back of the nickel. It takes twenty nickels to equal one dollar!

THE DIME



The dime is worth ten cents. Franklin D. Roosevelt was our 32nd President and is on the front of the dime. On the back of the dime is a picture of a torch which represents liberty, an olive branch which represents peace, and an oak branch which represents strength and independence. It takes ten dimes to equal one dollar!

The quarter is worth twenty-five cents. George Washington was our 1st President and is on the front of the quarter. A picture of an eagle is on the back of most quarters, but some quarters have one of our fifty states on the back. It takes four quarters to equal one dollar!

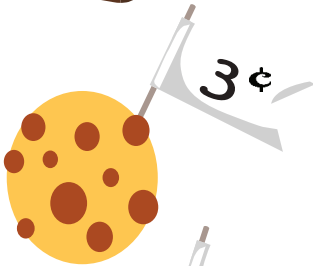
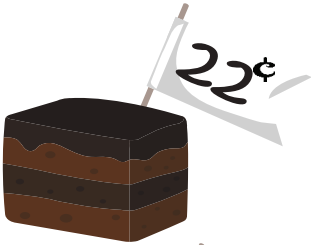

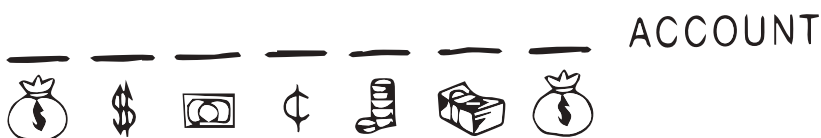
